INTRODUCTION

 - how many COAB reps should present at an event?
 - should a police officer (or other PPB staff?) be part of every presentation?
 - we can use a projector or a printed chart-pac of the presentation
 - what are the important take-aways for the attendees?
 - what are the important take-aways for the presenters?
