

COAB Work Plan Accomplishments to Date & the Work Ahead

- A) Independently assess the implementation of the Settlement agreement
 - a. Examples of work to-date:
 - i. COCL Compliance Reports: COAB reviewed two quarterly reports and one semiannual report.
 - ii. Subcommittees have reviewed subject-specific information related to the Settlement Agreement (i.e., MHCRS reviewed ECIT training)
 - b. Work ahead:
 - i. The next draft COCL semiannual report will be released in October 2016 for COAB review.

Question: How well is the current semiannual report review process working for COAB?

- B) Make recommendations to the parties and the COCL on additional actions
 - a. Examples of work to-date:
 - i. COAB has made over 50 recommendations to DOJ and PPB
 - b. Work ahead:
 - i. Pending DSUFCS recommendation on 0310.40 Courtesy

Question: How well is the current recommendation process working?

- C) Advise the Chief of Police and the Police and the Police Commissioner on strategies to improve community relations.
 - a. Examples of work to-date:
 - i. COAB made a recommendation directly to Chief and Police Commissioner to eliminate the 48-hour rule
 - b. *Work ahead:*
 - i. COAB was slated to meet with the Mayor and the Chief (and others) on May 26, per par. 152. This meeting was postponed, and staff is working to reschedule.

Question: What would COAB like to accomplish during the Mayor-Chief meeting?

- D) Provide the the community with information on the Settlement Agreement
 - a. Examples of work to-date:
 - i. CEOPS has led development of a Speakers Bureau
 - ii. Speaker's Bureau now has information packets for COAB to use when presenting to community

- iii. Members of COAB have done media interviews to discuss COAB's work, including specific recommendations
- iv. COAB meetings are livestreamed, broadcast on Portland Community Media, and archived on YouTube.
- v. COAB meetings are open to the public.
- b. Work ahead:
 - i. Continued scheduling of Speakers Bureau

Question: What are other ways to provide the community with information on the Settlement Agreement?

- E) Contribute to the development and implementation of a PPB Community Engagement and Outreach Plan
 - a. Examples of work to-date:
 - i. Reviewed CEO Plan phased development plan (developed with CEOPS); Currently in Phase 1—Initial Assessment
 - ii. Hosted first of two public hearings regarding PPB's outreach efforts
 - iii. Participated in development of PPB Community Relations citywide survey
 - iv. Hosted "3 Big Questions" Workshop; Other community groups are holding these workshops, as well
 - v. Requested six focus groups to augment citywide survey (these will begin with a month)
 - vi. Begun process to "solicit and consider input from the Human Rights Commission's Community Police Relations Committee ("CPRC"), including its work to implement the 2009 PPB "Plan to Address Racial Profiling"
 - b. Work ahead:
 - i. Continue soliciting feedback on "3 Big Questions"
 - ii. Phase 2 (and beyond) of CEO Plan development—vision and framework, 2nd public hearing, recommendations

Question: How can COAB solicit additional community responses to the "3 Big Questions," to inform the CEO Plan recommendations?

- F) Receive public comment and concerns
 - a. Examples of work to-date and ahead:
 - i. Public comment periods at all COAB meetings and subcommittee meetings
 - ii. COAB members attend quarterly COCL Town Halls and receive public comment and concerns
 - iii. COCL-COAB.org forums
 - b. Work ahead:

- i. 2nd public hearing on the CEO Plan
